In 2025, we will continue to change the world. If you want to change with world too, please join us! We have the following board positions open (and we're ALWAYS looking for volunteers):



Air & Space Forces Association Nation Convention – By Linda Aldrich

As is tradition, our Colorado delegation turned out in force for all events of the 2024 AFA National Convention at the Gaylord in Maryland. Colorado delegates Mike Sumida, Rick Ragaller, Jerry White, Joan Sell, Shannon Farrell, Emily Sawicki, Brent Sawicki, Caty Rozema, Linda Aldrich and Kristen Christy represented three of the four Colorado Chapters, along with Vice Chair of the Board-Education, Stephen Gourley. Not only did we fill nearly all our allotted delegate positions, but we filled every allotted voting position to determine National Board members prior to the Convention. The approach to voting for National officers pre-Convention was a first-time implementation, with voting done on-line up to midnight the first day of the Convention. By so doing, many more members nationwide had their voices heard at the Convention even if they were unable to attend in person. The Rocky Mountain Region was also represented by a full roster of Utah delegates.

Each delegate chose what was of greatest interest to them or their Chapter from the list of four National Convention Workshops. Len Vernamonti led the presentation on the Heritage Committee, a source for our Chapters to get ideas on Vietnam recognition events and to secure Vietnam veteran pins for our local veterans. Paul Hendricks, the newly elected National secretary, gave an advocacy update, a committee in which our own Mike Sumida has been the Colorado representative. Advocacy involves more than just talking about AFA; it also extends to how our local recruiters should be involved in AFA Chapters for the mutual benefit of recruiting and mentoring. Advocacy also addresses Enlisted pay raises, childcare, ICBM modernization and a wealth of issues that affect us all on a national level. Janelle Stafford offered a wealth of suggestions for building stronger chapter and field leaders, the majority of which have direct application for Colorado Chapters. Janelle was recognized as the National Member of the Year, a well-deserved award for all the time and innovation she has brought to AFA. Finally, a much-needed education session was presented by Todd Freece on Understanding and Supporting Space Force Guardians at the Chapter Level. Saturday afternoon kicked off with a welcome by Chairman, Bernie Scoch, introducing two days of business sessions and announcement of the newly elected National officers. National election results: Gary Copsey, Vice Chair of the Board Education; Paul Hendricks, National Secretary; Chuck Martin, National Treasurer; Bobi Oates, National Director for the West Geographical Area; and Doug "Odie" Slocum and Dan "Ohno" Ohnesorge, National Directors at large. Congratulations to our officers. We know we will continue strong and effective leadership for AFA!

It's no surprise the Awards Banquet at the Annual Convention is the highlight of the trip for most of us. As always, it is a grand event in a ballroom at the National Harbor Gaylord with big screens, music to accompany each award and lots of shouting and cheering as our Chapters receive awards. Once again, Mel Harmon Chapter in Pueblo was Colorado's star of the show with Mike Sumida receiving, on behalf of the Chapter, Aerospace Education Achievement, Aerospace Education Excellence Award - Small Chapter, Community Partner Achievement Award, Community Partner Gold Award, and National Best Small Chapter Award. Stephen Gourley proudly accepted the Aerospace Education Achievement and Exceptional Service Award - United Forces & Families for the Mile High Chapter. Additionally, Caty Rozema was recognized individually as a Medal of Merit Recipient! Because not all of our individual award winners were able to attend, we recognized Kenn Bowens, Mark "Yak" Maryak, and Patricia Swan at the State Awards Banquet as Medal of Merit recipients. Well done, Colorado, you certainly represent the dedication of our local volunteers.

Saturday evening closed with Regional Caucuses, one being held for Rocky Mountain Region and run by Fran Bradshaw from Utah. The primary discussion was on organizing a committee with members from each Rocky Mountain Region (Colorado, Utah, Wyoming) to recruit executive board members for the next two-year term, to include more than just the Region president. Having a full executive board will allow for better communication to the state chapter, facilitate mentoring an incoming president for the turn-over every two years, and help ease the burden of award reviews and information flow for the president. The measure was approved by the delegates.

The AFA National Convention is always a huge opportunity for delegates to gather information and a host of materials to take back to our Chapters in the field to better support the mission of AFA. Our delegates are looking forward to the quarterly state meetings where they will have an opportunity to share all the suggestions and recommendations acquired

from the National presentations. We understand it is expensive to travel to the east coast, so we are particularly appreciative of the delegates who donated their time and finances to make the trip. We owe a huge thank you to the AFA National Staff for the enormous amount of planning, preparation and time required to bring about an event such as the Convention. Every year is a success most certainly because of their outstanding efforts.


